Professor Caterina Conte

Prof. Conte is an Associate Professor of Internal Medicine at San Raffaele Roma Open University in Rome, Italy. She graduated from Sapienza Università di Roma School of Medicine, Rome, Italy, and subsequently specialized in Internal Medicine. During her residency, she undertook a research fellowship at the Center for Human Nutrition, Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, MO, USA, where she received training on the use of stable isotope tracers to evaluate the mechanisms responsible for the metabolic abnormalities associated with obesity. She then moved to Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, Rome, Italy, where she obtained a PhD in Endocrine and Metabolic Science, and stayed as a post-doctoral fellow until 2016, when she moved to IRCCS San Raffaele Hospital - Vita-Salute San Raffaele University in Milan. In 2020 she was appointed to her current position at San Raffaele Roma Open University. She also serves as a physician-scientist at the Department of Endocrinology, Nutrition and Metabolic Diseases at IRCCS Multimedica in Milan, Italy. Her research focuses on obesity and obesity-associated metabolic alterations, including sarcopenic obesity.



Diana Cardenas MD, PhD

Doctor Cardenas is a medical doctor with a master degree in science and nutrition from the Université de Paris Diderot, a master

degree in Political Science and International Relations from Université de Lyon and a PhD in philosophy from Université Franche-Compté, France. She has been working on bioethics and human rights for the last decade. The focus of her research is on the link between ethics and clinical nutrition. Since 2020, she is the coordinator of the International Working group for patients right to nutritional care.

She is currently a physician at the Nutrition Unit of the Cancer Center Institut Gustave Roussy in France. She is a member and a collaborator of the Colombian Clinical Nutrition Association (ACNC), the Francophone Society on Clinical Nutrition and Metabolism (SFNCM), ASPEN and ESPEN.



Han Ping Shi, MD, PhD, FACS

Han Ping Shi obtained his MD from School of Medicine, Wuhan University in Wuhan, PhD from the Second Military Medical University in Shanghai, and completed his postdoctoral training at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, and Rutgers University in Newark. Dr Shi is Professor of Surgery, Oncology and Clinical Nutrition at China Capital Medical University. Seeing the effect of malnutrition and the value of nutrition care, Dr. Shi initiates “hunger-free hospital” and advocates “nutrition the first-line therapy”. Dr Shi has served on the board of the Chinese Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (CSPEN) since 2011, and was President of the CSPEN from 2018 to 2021. Dr. Shi is also the Founding President of the Chinese Society of Nutritional Oncology (CSNO), and Founding Editor-in-Chief of Journal of Nutritional Oncology and Precision Nutrition. Dr. Shi has authored more than five-hundred original research papers, review articles, and editorials. His particular research interests include the pathophysiology, diagnosis and treatment of malnutrition, cachexia, and sarcopenia, especially in cancer.



Dr Gustavo Duarte Pimentel, studied nutrition at the Methodist University of Piracicaba, Brazil. After receiving Bachelor's Degree in Nutrition, he specialized in 2008 in Nutrition care of patient and sports nutrition, Paulista State University (UNESP), Botucatu, São Paulo, Brazil. Subsequently, he has done Master in Health Science, Nutrition Post-graduate Program, Federal University of Sao Paulo (UNIFESP), Sao Paulo, Brazil in 2010. Post graduate Program, State University of Campinas (UNICAMP), Sao Paulo, Brazil, with Sandwich doctorate for 12 months at the University of Santiago de Compostela, Spain. Since 2015 he has been as staff member at Federal University of Goias (UFG), Faculty of Nutrition, Goiania, Brazil. Since 2019 he receives research productivity scholarship (PQ-2) of the National Council for Scientific and Technological Development (CNPq, Brazil) in the area of Nutrition. He is author of >120 scientific indexed in Pubmed. Since 2017 he is Associate Editor of Clinical Nutrition ESPEN. Since 2018 he is Member of the Scientific and Fiscal Council of the Brazilian Association of Sports Nutrition (ABNE). The focus of his current clinical and research work is cross-sectional studies, muscle mass, inflammation and clinical nutrition and sports guidelines-based nutritional intervention.



Faidon Magkos is Associate Professor in Obesity and Energy Balance at the Department of Nutrition, Exercise and Sports, University of Copenhagen, Denmark; and an Honorary Associate Professor at the Division of Medicine, University College London, United Kingdom. Prior to these appointments, he has served as Assistant Professor in Medicine at the Center for Human Nutrition, Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, Missouri, and Assistant Professor in Physiology at the Clinical Nutrition Research Centre, National University of Singapore. He has a Bachelor degree in Human Nutrition and Dietetics, a Master's degree in Nutrition and Exercise, and a PhD in Human Metabolism. He has completed postdoc appointments at Harokopio University of Athens, Greece, and Harvard Medical School in Boston, Massachusetts. As of June 2022, he has published 184 peer-reviewed papers and his work has been cited >9000 times. His h-index is 47 and field-weighted citation index is 4.8. The main area of his research expertise revolves around the effects of diet and exercise on body weight

homeostasis and metabolic function, the cardiometabolic complications of excess fat accumulation, and how these can be rectified by weight loss.



Jose M. Soriano is Professor of Nutrition and Director of Food and Health Lab in the European Network of Living Labs (ENOLL), University of Valencia, Director of University Clinic of Nutrition, Physical Activity and Physiotherapy at Lluís Alcanyís Foundation-University of Valencia and Co-Director of Joint Research Unit on Endocrinology, Nutrition and Clinical Dietetics at University of Valencia-Health Research Institute Hospital La Fe, Spain. He has Degree in Pharmacy, in 1996, and Degree in Human Nutrition and Dietetics, in 2018. He undertook a PhD in Pharmacy with an Extraordinary Doctorate Award in 2001. His clinical interests include clinical nutrition and the study of human gut microbiome and new biomarkers applied in nutrition, with over 210 peer-reviewed publications to-date, as well as 20 book chapters and books. He was Editor-in-Chief in the Spanish Journal of Human Nutrition and Dietetics (2016-2019). He has won two research (at Institute for Egg Studies and Group of Food Microbiology from The Spanish Society of Microbiology), two teaching (at the Professor Vicente Callao's Charity-Teacher Association and Spanish Ministry of Education) and two development cooperation (at Valencia City Council and University of Valencia) awards. Nowadays, he has a H-index of 45 and i10-index of 102.



Mehmet I. Naharci, Professor

Dr. Naharci is currently Professor of Geriatrician at the University of Health Sciences, Chair of the Geriatrics Division of Gulhane Faculty of Medicine & Gulhane Training and Research Hospital. Naharci spends most of his clinical time managing geriatric patients in an outpatient setting. Dr. Naharci research interests include dementia, cognition, nutrition, frailty, osteoporosis, falls, and preventive medicine.
